

Top water efficiency tips

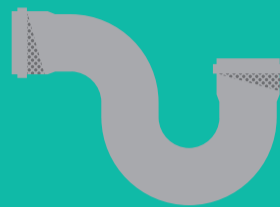

Educate your employees on the importance and practices of water efficiency, try and set water usage targets and encourage widespread involvement to achieve this!

You can help save water by checking for leaking pipes inside your property and fixing dripping taps. Use dual flush toilets instead of the older style 'pull' chain systems.

Water recreational space, gardens and plants only if absolutely necessary and where possible, with harvested rain water.

Swap standard tap valves for low flow aerators or pre-rinse valves on your pot wash.

The government's Enhanced Capital Allowance (ECA) scheme lets businesses claim back 100% first year capital allowances on certain water efficient technologies and products.

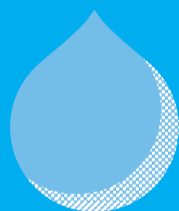
Smart technology now allows businesses to monitor and get data on water usage on a daily or even hourly basis. This can help identify areas where savings can be made.

Reducing the amount of water you use overall helps protect the water sources used in supply, while cutting the energy needed for the treating and pumping of it.

If your building doesn't have any urinal controls, during a 40 hour week, 75% of flushing occurs when no-one is even there. At around £500 per year per urinal, you're literally flushing money down the pan!
